Thank you for your letter dated February 24, 2006 on the subject and for Janetta Pritchard's time in reviewing the project with me. On behalf of the Trans Alaska Pipeline System owner companies, we take this opportunity to comment on the proposed decision.

Alyeska Pipeline Service Company, agent, has reviewed the material in the public notice. From this review, it is apparent that the origin of this project may be located on private, ANCSA lands within a mile of the Trans Alaska Pipeline System right-of-way, perhaps near pipeline milepost 683 approximately one mile north of the Glenn Highway-TAPS crossing. It also appears that the proposed spur line would not involve any crossing of TAPS.

Please let me know if these conclusions by Alyeska are incorrect. At this time, there is not enough information on the project to determine if the proposed origin location presents concerns for TAPS integrity or safety. We request to be kept on your distribution list for information updates on this project.
