**NOTICE OF APPLICATION UNDER AS 38.35.070
ANCHOR POINT ENERGY, LLC
RIGHT-OF-WAY LEASE APPLICATION
MARCH 4, 2010**

The Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources, pursuant to AS 38.35.070, hereby gives notice that Anchor Point Energy, LLC submitted an application dated February 18, 2010, in accordance with the Alaska Right-of-Way Leasing Act, AS 38.35.050, for the proposed North Fork Pipeline right-of-way lease.

Anchor Point Energy, LLC proposes to construct a buried pipeline to transport natural gas. The proposed pipeline will extend from the North Fork Unit production pad, an existing pad, located at the east end of Wagon Road, and adjacent to North Fork Road, to the most southern point near the community of Anchor Point. The proposed pipeline right-of-way may contain one or two 4" inch diameter lines. Each line may transport a potential flow rate of up to nine million standard cubic feet per day (mmscfd) per line, for a cumulative total of eighteen mmscfd of natural gas at 1300 psig, (pounds per square inch gauged), if both lines are constructed. At the time of this notice, the applicant had not determined if they would construct one or two lines.

Construction is scheduled to begin in September 2010 with project completion projected for March 2011. Anchor Point Energy, LLC has requested a 50-foot wide right of way for construction of the pipeline, and a 20-foot wide permanent right-of-way. During construction, the right-of-way on state owned or managed lands will be approximately 17.6 acres. This will be reduced, post-construction, to approximately 7.0 acres for the permanent right-of-way. The proposed right-of-way begins at milepost 8.9 of the North Fork Road and primarily follows westward from the North Fork Unit Pad along Wagon Road to Hand Cart Road, to Gold Avenue, and then through undeveloped State of Alaska lands, then along a section line easement adjacent to Cook Inlet Region, Inc. lands, crossing the North Fork River, to its termination near the North Fork Road and Sterling Highway intersection.

The proposed North Fork Pipeline will be buried along its entire length, will be eight miles in length, and approximately 2.9 miles of the proposed pipeline right of way will be located on lands owned or managed by the State of Alaska. State lands are described below starting with the most easterly segment and moving in a westward direction. The following is a general description of the State lands that are requested for the pipeline right-of-way lease. All land is located within the Seward Meridian, Third Judicial District, State of Alaska.

Township 4 South, Range 14 West, Sections 26, 27, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35
Township 4 South, Range 15 West, Sections 34, 35, 36
Township 5 South, Range 14 West, Sections 6
Township 5 South, Range 15 West, Sections 1, 2, 3, 4

Alaska Statute 38.35.200 governs judicial review of decisions of the commissioner on application:

38.35.200. Judicial review of decisions of commissioner on application.

(a) An applicant or competing applicant or a person who has a direct financial interest affected by the lease who raises objections within 60 days of the publication of notice under AS 38.35.070 are the only persons with standing to seek judicial review of a decision of the commissioner under AS 38.35.100.

(b) The only grounds for judicial review of a decision of the commissioner are

(1) failure to follow the procedures set out in this chapter; or

(2) abuse of discretion so capricious, arbitrary, or confiscatory as to constitute a denial of due process.

Any objections pursuant to 38.35.200 must be submitted in writing to the State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources, State Pipeline Coordinator's Office via letter, email, or facsimile:
